Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

This summer we shared with you a second series of articles about our seminarians in **The Register**. I am hopeful that by reading them you were able to learn a little more about the nine men who are currently discerning a call to priesthood. God willing, these are the men who will one day serve as Priests for the Diocese of Salina. It is my hope that when you now pray for these men, or see their picture on a Seminarian poster, you will recall a few personal things about them. They are exceptional men and, in many respects, my heroes.

We are truly blessed with these candidates for priesthood, but along with this blessing is the challenge of paying for their education and formation. With the need for future priestly ministry in our Diocese already so evident there is no more worthy cause than their educational support.

The Seminarian collection will take place next weekend in your parishes. This special collection assists us with **current** Seminarian expenses. You may recall that our capital campaign, **Yesterday, Today and Forever**, reached our goal of three million dollars for seminarian education. That money, however, is entirely restricted to our endowment. The interest generated by the endowment (about \$100,000 this year) pays for about one-third of the actual cost of seminarian education, which is about \$300,000 per year. While these endowed funds will help immensely in the future, it is for our **current needs** that we now seek your help. In discerning God's call these men are doing all that we have asked of them. Please join me in likewise responding well by providing for their education and formation needs.

In today's *Register* is your copy of this year's seminarian poster. I would encourage you to place it in your home where you will see it daily and remember these men in your prayers. I would add too that not only are we fortunate to have these men in formation but we also have other men continuing to make inquiries about priesthood. The addition of Rev. Kevin Weber as an Associate Vocations Director and the addition of Fr. Gale Hammerschmidt as a new member of our Vocations Board helps us to keep our focus on this critical need for the Church.

Our seminarians are among some of our greatest examples of stewardship--giving God and His Church the gift of our lives. I continue to be grateful to you for your support for these men. I humbly ask you to consider prayerfully a gift to this very important collection.

THOUGHTS ON STEWARDSHIP
