UPDATE ON NEW WALL IN THE CHURCH

We are making progress on the new wall to be installed in the church to separate the gathering space from the body of the church. We are currently meeting with people from the glass company, the cabinet company, a construction engineer and a mechanical engineer. Our hope is to get a design and cost estimate soon. We will then need to get it approved by an architect before we present it to the city commission for approval. After the city commission approves the project, we will then be able to build and install the wall. Even though there are many meetings and steps yet to complete, we hope this will all be accomplished before the summer heat increases our air conditioning bill.
